POSTERS

You must **deliver the poster** file before **November 20**, for upload to the web, with the following **specifications**:

- Posters should be delivered in PDF format, preferably, but .jpg format is also accepted.

- The font size used cannot be smaller than 12p.
- We recommend sans-serif fonts such as Arial, Open Sans, Nurito, Montserrat or Roboto.
- The file / image size must not exceed 1200 px wide and 1700 px high.
- We recommend a resolution of 100 dpi. Never less than 72 dpi, nor greater than 150 dpi.

- In case of your file is too heavy to attach by email, we recommend the ILOVEPDF tool for PDF compression, and TIPYJPG for JPG compression. You can also send us the file using the online tool WETRANSFER. The email address for the reception of posters is <u>irene@estudio-27.com</u>

We will send an email confirming the correct reception of the same. In future emails we will send the access data to the private part of the web for the day of the event.

On the day of the event, the poster will be published in the private part of the workshop, along with the possibility of sending questions about it. These questions will be answered during the live session in the afternoon, with a short interview of 10 minutes about your poster. Please, keep waiting for more information on the hours in which you must be present at the workshop to answer them live. After the workshop, you will also have the possibility to answer more questions in writing, in the publication area of your poster.

4 ORAL COMMUNICATION

There are **two options** for the presentation of oral communications:

- **Record a video** (10 minutes long) and send it before November 20.
- **Present live**: sharing screen, and explaining the presentation live (no need to send the presentation in advance)

Recommendations for the video sending option:

- You should record your video in full screen, preferably in landscape format (16: 9) with a size of 1280x720px at 720 DPI

- In Windows 8 operating systems onwards, the option to record screen is included. (Keyboard shortcut WIN + G; on MAC the keyboard shortcut is CMD + SHIFT + 5.)

- If you do not have any video editing or image recording program, we recommend the tool: VLC. Executable on all platforms.

- We recommend that you DO NOT attach your webcam thumbnail to the presentation file, as we ask attendees to be present at the presentation and your webcam display would be duplicated.

- You can send your file using the online tool WETRANSFER. The email address for the reception of posters is <u>irene@estudio-27.com</u>. We will send an email confirming the correct reception of the same.

Recommendations for the live presentation option:

- On the day of the event, prepare a light background, ideally white and with good natural lighting -but not direct sun-. If you do not have a white background, you can use the zoom backgrounds, if you access from your zoom account.

- Adjust your camera's view to focus from the edge of the table - your hands are visible - to a wide gap above your head.

- Avoid putting the camera too high or too low. Ideally, it is at or below eye level.

- Avoid distractions such as unwanted noise, calls, or camera shake.

- You will be able to share your screen for presentations. Have the information open in different tabs before starting the video call, so that you can share it with a couple of clicks.

General information:

- Remember that in the online workshop you will enter "guest" mode and will not have access to your microphone and webcam until the moderator grants you the "speaker" permission.

- In case you cannot be present for the entire symposium, please connect at least 15 minutes before your entry according to the schedule that we will send in the following emails. That will give us time to fix last minute unforeseen events.

- After viewing your video / presentation in the Workshop, we will save 5 minutes for you to respond live to questions from attendees. The moderator will always guide you.

After the presentation and the live question and answer session, a comment area will be enabled in the private part of the web so that attendees can send you more questions.
