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Since 1990, lecturer in English Language. His fields of research are syntax, pragmatics, psycholinguistics (with special emphasis on language parsing and processing) and the history of English. He also takes an interest in discourse analysis, and cognitive science. Most of his teaching activities are related to diachronic linguistics, the history of English and different theories of language change. He has taught –among other subjects- *English Phonetics and Phonology* (1st year, undergraduate), *History of the English Language I* (undergraduate, fourth year) *History of the English Language II* (undergraduate, fifth year) and *Theory of Language Change* (undergraduate, fifth year). He is a regular participant in international conferences on historical linguistics and has a number of international publications in those fields.

Other fields of research he is interested in are translation and music. He has translated a number of books and acted as translator-interpreter in several conferences organised by the department of musicology of the Universidad de Oviedo and the Fundación Universidad de Oviedo.

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
